5) In the Bohr theory of the structure of the hydrogen atom the energies of the various quantum states are given by:

$$E_n = - \frac{me^4}{2N^2\hbar^2}$$

With:  $m$  the mass of the electron  
 $e$  the electric charge of the electron  
 $\hbar$  Planck's constant divided by  $2\pi$

If:  $\sigma_m/m = 0.1\%$  (i.e. the mass is known to 0.1%)  
 $\sigma_e/e = 0.2\%$  (i.e. the charge is known to 0.2%)  
 $\sigma_{\hbar} / \hbar = 0.1\%$

a) Calculate  $\sigma_E/E$  for arbitrary  $N$ .

b) If the precision of  $\sigma_E/E$  is to be improved which of the three quantities should be determined more precisely?
