AN ELECTRONIC VERSION OF THE TRANSMISSION SPECTRUM OF MOLECULAR IODINE, 14500-20000 cm⁻¹

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The absorption spectrum of the $B \leftarrow X$ transition of molecular iodine has been recorded at Doppler resolution, in the region 14500 - 20000 cm⁻¹, on a Fourier transform spectrometer. Calibration has been checked against the Doppler-Free High Resolution Spectral Atlas of the Iodine Molecule^a across the region common to both spectra. Our version of the iodine atlas, which was originally produced at Orsay,^b avoids the need for systematic wavenumber corrections^c to short-wavelength peaks, and should be compatible with any software. It has proved a convenient tool in our laboratory, and we hope others may also find it useful. The transmission spectrum is available, on request, as a single ascii file.
